

## Reopening Queen Mary's Hospital Minor Injuries Unit

The Minor Injuries Unit at Queen Mary's Hospital is now reopening in November.

Thank you to everyone who joined my campaign. In a normal year, up to 18,000 people attend the Unit, but since it closed in March local residents have been sent to Teddington Walk-in Centre, or to Kingston or St Georges A and E. This is unacceptably far. I am also concerned about rising numbers of people who are not getting a cancer diagnosis as a result of COVID.

When a date for reopening was not agreed, I held a debate in the House of Commons to call for it to be reopened. This service will be reviewed in March and so **I will continue to stand up for our local health services.**

The new unit will have GPs and nurse practitioners available for regular child and adult health care, screening and urgent treatment. Call 111 to make a booking and do not attend if you have Covid symptoms.

## Getting a COVID test and flu vaccine

**If you have been advised to get a COVID test, there is a regional test centre at Twickenham and a pop-up test centre is also now operating from Wandsworth Town Hall.**

Opening times and information on booking can be found on Wandsworth Council's website. I lobbied the Government for a permanent COVID testing site in Wandsworth and continue to lobby for more flu vaccines.

## Standing up for local jobs

**Throughout the pandemic I have met with local people most affected.**



These include creative industry staff, travel and aviation staff, dentists and nursery school heads, and demanded sector-specific support and extensions to furlough to save jobs, industries and services. I wrote to the Chancellor 15 times regarding the self-employed scheme (SEISS) and I was pleased that the Government extended the scheme until October and will continue to support the many self-employed workers in the constituency. ## Protecting renters

**The Government has ended the ban on evictions and this applies to anyone renting privately and residents in council or housing association accommodation.**

If you are being threatened with eviction please contact me or Wandsworth Council. We must ensure that all renters are treated fairly given that many people are struggling to pay their bills. I will continue to campaign for the government to fully fund a house building campaign that provides genuinely affordable homes for local people.



## Leaving the EU and the impact of COVID

**The negotiations to leave the EU have continued and I know many local businesses will be affected - now even more so because of the pandemic.**

## Standing up for you

**An MP's office is always busy, but the pandemic has seen my casework increase by thousands of cases.**
